MINUTES
COUNCIL MEETING
NOVEMBER 1, 2010
6:00 P. M.**

Mayor Foreman called the Meeting to order at 6:00 P.M. The following Councilmembers were present: Kay Ackerson, Bill Dieruf, Anita Johnson, Ray Perkins, Daniel Ruckriegel, Carol Pike, David Olshansky and Pam Ware. Also present Fred E. Fischer, City Attorney, and Jim Leidgen, Clerk-Treasurer.

CALL TO ORDER

Reverend Tom Dillard gave the opening prayer which was followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Mayor Foreman recognized Jane Meuller, 1305 Bentwood Way, who addressed the Mayor and City Council on behalf of the residents of Woodcroft to request a response to the following matters of concern: the status of the sidewalks on Moser Road; the possibility of repainting the yellow and white stripes/traffic markings on Linn Station Road; and, the elimination of vehicle parking on Linn Station Road, possibly No Parking signs. In response, Mayor Foreman addressed each concern as follows: the City hasn't, as yet, received any response from the 3 residents affected by the sidewalks on Moser Road.; the City will repaint the traffic stripes on Linn Station Road; and, the Police Department will investigate and assess the parking situation on Linn Station Road.

Councilmember Johnson recognized members of Troop 212 from South East Christian Church who are in attendance to satisfy a portion of their service requirements. Councilmember Johnson reported she has had a conversation with three business women with locations near the Fire Station who wanted to know what they need to do to be included in the Saturday, December 4th, Holiday on Gaslight Square activities. Mayor Foreman asked that Councilmember Johnson have the women contact him.

Councilmember Ray Perkins -- Legislative Committee -- No Report.

Councilmember Daniel Ruckriegel, Finance Committee, suggested, in response to a complaint regarding political signs placed in a right-of-way, that the City have a policy in place to permit Public Works to remove the signs. A discussion followed. Mayor Foreman commented that the Public Works Director investigates complaints about signs in a specific location; and, if they are in the right-of-way or blocking site lines for motorists, he removes them to Public Works where they can be picked up by the owner within thirty days. Discussion continued.

Councilmember Carol Pike -- Parks & Recreation Committee -- No Report.


Councilmember David Olshansky, Safety Committee, reported that the activity permits for organizations requesting dates for walk/runs is costly to our Police Department in time and money. Chief Richard Sanders commented that, though these events are well intended, the Police Department incurs overtime costs for officers and must field numerous complaints from residents regarding street closures. Councilmember Olshansky suggested these events could utilize the City's new pedestrian trail system rather than close City streets for periods of

ALTERNATIVES**


