



Code of Conduct

While visiting Plainview Swim Center, the following general activities will not be accepted:

Violations of the law as well as:

- Any activity that threatens the safety of our guests and/or employees
- Any activity that threatens the well-being of the property
- Any activity that disrupts our pleasant, family-oriented environment
- Any activity inconsistent with the general purpose of the property

Examples of specific activities that are prohibited include but are not limited to:

- Disruptive profanity, vulgar or threatening language
- Unnecessarily blocking walkways or building access
- Running, horseplay or disorderly conduct of any nature
- Excessive loitering
- Violating the safety directions of a lifeguard
- Littering
- Operating unauthorized recreational and/or personal transportation devices in the pool center, this includes skates, scooters, skateboards, etc
- No firearms or illegal weapons
- Violating any other posted rules

Guests who do not act responsibly may be asked to leave. If they refuse to leave the property, they may be arrested and prosecuted for criminal trespass

Parental Guidance Required at Plainview Swim Center

We're committed to providing a comfortable environment for all our guests. We require that those 17 and under be accompanied at all times by a parent or supervising adult age 21 or older after 3 pm Monday – Friday and from 10 am – 9 pm on Saturday and Sunday.

1. Visitors 17 years of age and younger are required to be accompanied at all times by a parent or supervising adult age 21 or older on after 3 pm Monday – Friday and from 10 am – 9 pm on Saturday and Sunday.
2. Unsupervised youth swimming prior to 3 pm on Monday – Friday evenings must leave the center by 3 pm or immediately be joined by a parent or supervising adult 21 or older.
3. Proof of age may be required for the youth or supervising adult. Those who lack proper identification may be asked to leave the property.
4. Valid identification includes a state issued driver's license or ID card, a military ID, a school ID card, or a passport. The identification must be tamper proof and include a photograph and date of birth.
5. One adult may accompany up to four youths. **All accompanied youths must remain with the supervising adult.***
6. Supervising adults are responsible for the actions of the youth they accompany.

Guests who do not act responsibly may be asked to leave. If they refuse to leave the property, they may be arrested and prosecuted for criminal trespass.
